## Motivational Interviewing (MI) with Neurobehavioral and Neurocognitive Deficits

### **Training Description**

Persons who present with neurobehavioral and/or neurocognitive deficits have complications with awareness, motivations, decisions, memory, impulsivity, and /or interpersonal relationship abilities. This training will explore how to adapt MI skills, techniques and the Spirit of MI with each of these individual differences, specifically reviewing case examples related to persons with traumatic brain injury (TBI), Intellectual Disability (ID), autism spectrum disorder (ASD), and fetal alcohol spectrum disorder (FASD). Learn how to conceptualize strategies with these differing presentations to help guide persons through the rehabilitation and change process. Additionally, attendees will participate in exercises to increase self-awareness in order to recognize situations where it may be challenging to adhere to the Spirit of MI.

It is presumed attendees will have previous experience in Motivational Interviewing and is not an introduction to MI. This course will offer a brief review of MI and provide the attendee with specific MI adherent strategies in multiple contexts as described above. Attendees will be asked to participate in several experiential opportunities to practice applicable, take away skills to implement in their work.

### **Training Objectives**

- 1. Review of Motivational Interviewing skills, techniques, processes and the Spirit.
- 2. Provide a brief overview of the latest research related to MI effectiveness.
- 3. Learn an increased understanding and awareness of differing presentations when working with neurobehavioral and neurocognitive deficits in client populations and how to recognize these and individualize MI application.
- 4. Increase ability to adapt MI strategies to differing presentations (TBI, ID, ASD, and FASD) through case examples and audience participation.
- 5. Increase self-awareness and ability to manage countertransference.

### Presenter Biographies

Ernie Marshall, LCSW, has worked in the nonprofit and public sectors in both clinical and administrative roles since 1996. His work has focused on populations traditionally considered resistant and hard to treat including: criminal justice, substance abuse, sexual offenders and multiply diagnosed individuals. He is a member of the **Motivational Interviewing Network of Trainers** (MINT) and has been conducting training for therapists and criminal justice organizations for 15 plus years. He is currently a Treatment Supervisor at Sand Ridge Secure Treatment Center where he is supervises the development and delivery of treatment for high risk sex offenders with elevated levels of psychopathy.

Leslie Barfknecht. LCSW, is a licensed clinical social worker in Minnesota and Wisconsin. She Leslie has spent her career working directly and in administrative roles with persons who have offended or are at risk of offending within the criminal justice and social services systems in both private and public sectors. She is a Treatment Supervisor at Sand Ridge Secure Treatment Center and supervises the development and delivery of treatment for high risk sexual offenders. Leslie is a member of the Motivational Interviewing Network of Trainers (MINT) and a Certified Trainer with the International Center for Clinical Excellence (ICCE).
