This course will offer the participant the opportunity to take a deeper look at MI and further an understanding of the underlying processes, including strategies to elicit and strengthen change talk and the intentional use of complex reflections. Additionally, there will be an emphasis on the importance of the MI Spirit, discussion on the reflection of self and the impact of the MI practitioner within the MI relationship. New insights about these concepts and the evolution of MI will be included as shared by Drs. Miller & Rollnick from the 2019 Annual Forum for the Motivational Interviewing Network of Trainers (MINT).

Training Objectives

1. Advanced awareness of the intertwine between the technical and relational components of MI
2. How to use reflections strategically and directionally to deepen change talk and commitment
3. Understanding of complementary theories to integrate when practicing MI to enhance effectiveness
4. Self-reflection, awareness and learning for the practitioner in MI interactions to enhance effectiveness
5. Strategies to attend to the working relationship and staying pace with the client and their preferences

Presenter Biographies

Ernie Marshall, LCSW, has worked in the non-profit and public sectors in both clinical and administrative roles since 1996. His work has focused on populations traditionally considered resistant and hard to treat including: criminal justice, substance abuse, sexual offenders and multiply diagnosed individuals. He is a member of the Motivational Interviewing Network of Trainers (MINT) and has been conducting training for therapists and criminal justice organizations for 15 plus years. He is currently a Treatment Supervisor at Sand Ridge Secure Treatment Center where he supervises the development and delivery of treatment for high risk sex offenders with elevated levels of psychopathy.

Leslie Barfknecht is a licensed clinical social worker in Minnesota and Wisconsin. She Leslie has spent her career working directly and in administrative roles with persons who have offended or are at risk of offending within the criminal justice and social services systems in both private and public sectors. She is a Treatment Supervisor at Sand Ridge Secure Treatment Center and supervises the development and delivery of treatment for high risk sexual offenders. Leslie is a member of the Motivational Interviewing Network of Trainers (MINT) and a Certified Trainer with the International Center for Clinical Excellence (ICCE).
