Training Description

Confabulation, wherein an individual unintentionally fabricates a memory, is a complex phenomenon with multiple definitions and uncertain etiology. When confabulation is present within criminal justice, forensic mental health, and legal settings, it can have disastrous consequences. As such, it is imperative for professionals who work within these settings to increase their awareness and understanding of this topic. This training is intended for professionals employed within psycholegal settings and other related fields who want to learn how neuroscience research can provide a better understanding of confabulation and its associated features. Participants can also expect to learn how this research can be used to guide and inform clinical and forensic practice (e.g., screening, treatment, communication strategies, and intervention). Empirically-based research findings and case study examples will be highlighted throughout this training.

- 2. Describe at least three of the proposed neural correlates of confabulation
- 3. Name at least two of the core features and clinical signs and symptoms of confabulation
- 4. Examine common medical, mental health, and neurological comorbidities associated with confabulation
- 5. Explore the implications confabulation has in psycholegal settings
- 6. State three proposed neurobiological underpinnings of confabulation
- Describe how neuroscience research can provide a better understanding of confabulation and inform screening, intervention, and treatment

Presenter Biographies

Jerrod Brown, Ph.D., is an Assistant Professor for Concordia University, St. Paul, Minnesota and is the lead developer and program director for the Master of Arts degree in Human Services with an Emphasis in Forensic Behavioral Health. Jerrod has also been employed with Pathways Counseling Center in St. Paul, Minnesota for the past seventeen years. Pathways provides programs and services benefiting individuals impacted by mental illness and addictions. Jerrod is also the founder and CEO of the American Institute for the Advancement of Forensic Studies (AIAFS) and the Editor-in-Chief of Forensic Scholars Today (FST). Jerrod has completed four separate master's degree programs and holds graduate certificates in Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), Other Health Disabilities (OHD), and Traumatic-Brain Injuries (TBI). Jerrod is also certified as a Brain Health Coach, Trauma Professional, Compassion Fatigue Professional, Sleep Science Coach, Stress and Mindset Coach, Holistic Health Coach, Youth Firesetting Prevention/Intervention Specialist, an Anger Resolution Therapist (CART), a Thinking for a Change (T4C) Facilitator, a Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD) Trainer, an Autism Specialist, and a Mental Health Integrative Medicine Provider (CMHIMP).

Jennifer Sweeton, Psy.D., MS, MA. Originally trained as a neuroscientist, Dr. Jennifer Sweeton is a licensed clinical psychologist, best-selling author, and internationally-recognized expert on trauma, anxiety, and the neuroscience of mental health. Dr. Sweeton completed her doctoral training at the Stanford University School of Medicine, the Pacific Graduate School of Psychology, and the National Center for PTSD. Additionally, she holds a master's degree in affective neuroscience from Stanford University, and studied behavioral genetics at Harvard University. Dr. Sweeton resides in the greater Kansas City area, where she owns a group private practice, Kansas City Mental Health Associates, and co-owns Mind Works Professional Education, Inc., a continuing education company. She formerly served as the President of the Oklahoma Psychological Association, and holds adjunct faculty appointments at the University Of Kansas School Of Medicine and the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center. She is the current President of the Greater Kansas City Psychological Association. Dr. Sweeton offers psychological services to clients in Oklahoma, Kansas, and internationally, and is a sought-after trauma and neuroscience expert who has trained more than 10,000 mental health professionals in her workshops.
