Neurocriminology Informed Professional (NIP)

A 36-Hour On-Demand Certification Program

Neurocriminology is an interdisciplinary subfield of criminology that incorporates methodological approaches from neuroscience, physiology, genetics, biology, and psychology. The goal of neurocriminology is to better understand, predict, prevent, and treat criminal and violent behaviors. Although there is no single determinant of such actions, neurocriminology strives to identify different risk factors that increase the likelihood of specific criminal and violent behaviors. This continuing education training certification program provides attendees with an in-depth examination of the neurocriminology field and its potential implications for interviewing, screening and treating individuals involved in the criminal justice system. Attendees can also expect to learn how incorporating neurocriminology research into existing approaches can help allied disciplines work more effectively with clients who engage in anti-social, problematic, irrational, and other externalizing behaviors.

Professionals working within, or in partnership with, the fields of mental health, criminal justice, human services, and the legal system would benefit from this certification program. This comprehensive program features 12 distinctive on-demand training modules that cover different topics related to neurocriminology. Each training session will be approximately three hours long and accompanied by an agenda, handout, certificate of completion, and posttest.

Participants must complete all 12 on-demand training sessions to earn a certificate of completion for the program. Each training will be available for individual purchase, but to be eligible for the series certification, participants must register for the entire series, not for the on-demand trainings individually.

• As a bonus for registering for the series, participants will also have access to an exclusive monthly email where neurocriminology resources, insights, and opportunities for a Q & A will be provided; this email will continue for the duration of the program.

NOTE: At the onset of this program in January of 2023, <u>one session will be released monthly</u>. After the full series has been released (December 2023), there will be a certification exam that encompasses all twelve courses and must be passed to earn the NIP certification. Participants who register for this series will receive a code via email monthly as the training session for the month is being released. The code will allow participants in this certification program to then access the individual On-Demand training event and complete it at their own pace. Upon completion of all trainings, and online post-program exam, participants will earn a certification as a Neurocriminology Informed Professional (NIP).

This training is created and presented by **Jerrod Brown, Ph.D., MA, MS, MS**. Dr. Brown is a professor, trainer, researcher, and consultant with multiple years of experience teaching collegiate courses. Jerrod is also the founder and CEO of the American Institute for the Advancement of Forensic Studies (AIAFS).
