Training Description

This training focuses on threat assessment for targeted or intended violence within K-12 settings. We will focus on identifying the relevant bio-psycho-social factors associated with aggression and violence in youth, including a differentiation between reactive versus proactive violence. The training will subsequently identify key differences between threat and risk assessment models and identify relevant/empirically supported risk assessment instruments. We will review the Structured Assessment of Violence Risk in Youth and Early Assessment Risk List – 20B and 21G. We will subsequently review similarities and differences in risk versus threat management strategies.

Training Objectives

1. Identification of bio-psycho-social factors in assessment of risk in juveniles
2. Identification of key differences between threat and risk assessment in a school setting, K-12 grades.
3. Strategies to conduct threat assessments within a school setting.
4. Review relevant cultural and ethnic factors in threat assessment and management.
5. Review of relevant juvenile risk assessment measures
 - a. Introduction to Structured Assessment of Violence Risk in Youth
 - b. Introduction to Early Assessment Risk List – 20B and 21G
6. Identify practice tools for threat management and intervention.

Presenter Biographies

Kostas A. Katsavdakakis, Ph.D., ABPP is a Licensed Psychologist and Diplomate in Forensic Psychology with the American Board of Professional Psychology. He has extensive experience in Forensic Evaluations, the Clinical Assessment and Treatment of juveniles and adults and Threat Assessment and Management. Dr. Katsavdakakis is retained by Prosecutors, Defense Attorneys and the State/Federal Court to evaluate defendants charged with violent sexual and violent non-sexual crimes followed by testimony in Court. Dr. Katsavdakakis conducts threat assessments/management, including at the request of the United States Attorney's Office, Eastern District of New York for counter-terrorism related cases and as an Associate with Work Trauma Services, based in San Francisco, for workplace and campus settings. In addition to his forensic and threat management practice, he maintains a clinical caseload, providing individual treatment for adults and juveniles. Dr. Katsavdakakis has presented nationally on topics such as Threat Assessment and Management and is currently an Associate Professor-Adjunct at John Jay College of Criminal Justice where he teaches graduate and undergraduate courses in psychology of criminal behavior, forensic psychological testing, assessment of psychopathy and psychology/law.
