Training Description

The course will consist of six lectures. The first lecture will review adverse childhood experiences. The second lecture will review the epidemiology of childhood trauma and how childhood trauma turns into life-long trauma organization of individuals. The third lecture will focus on how trauma affects multiple domains of health in the long run. The fourth lecture will review the concept of trauma-informed care and systems and the steps of building such systems along with trauma prevention. The fifth lecture will review the tools and steps of trauma-informed assessment using video-recordings of mock family well-being assessment model established at the University of Iowa Child Protection Program. The last lecture will walk the audience through trauma-sensitive response concepts and practical application within multiple systems of care, thereby affording clients to feel emotionally and physically safe in all systems of care; including criminal justice setting, forensic mental health setting, medical setting, social services setting, educational setting among others. If time allows, a brief breakout session will be held with groups of ten to discuss how the trainees can transfer the knowledge from this session into their practice and agency.

1. Review childhood and life-long trauma categories
2. Learn how trauma impacts health
3. Define trauma-informed systems and care
4. List tools to use in trauma-informed assessment
5. Describe the steps of trauma-informed assessment
6. Understand trauma-sensitive responses and their importance

Presenter Biography

Resmiye Oral, MD, is a professor of pediatrics, who is a board-certified expert in child abuse pediatrics. She has completed her child abuse pediatrics fellowship at Ohio-State University and is currently working as the director of the Child Protection Program at the University of Iowa Children's Hospital, Iowa City, Iowa. She has published numerous articles on Child Abuse and Neglect. She became involved with child abuse and neglect in 1993 and established the first multidisciplinary child abuse and neglect follow-up team in Turkey, her country of origin. She wrote a book and three book chapters on child abuse for Turkish physicians. She also co-authored two training kits published by Ohio State University on physical and sexual abuse. Her interests are international systems building to address child abuse and neglect, drug endangered children, shaken baby syndrome, adverse childhood experiences and trauma-informed care, and early intervention with child abuse to prevent severe and usually irreversible consequences of abuse including fatality. In order to accomplish child abuse prevention, she believes that recognition of subtle findings of abuse and trauma screening of all clients are of utmost importance, which calls for training of all professionals involved with child abuse. She gives 50-60 lectures a year to medical and non-medical professional audiences on child abuse and neglect to regional, national and international audiences.
