Training Description

This workshop is intended for both evaluating and treating professionals tasked with providing opinions about the psychological fitness for duty of persons working in positions with a high risk of harm to the individual or others. These include physicians and other health care professionals, police and other public safety personnel, teachers, airline pilots, bus drivers, and utility workers, among others. The workshop will address federal statutes and practice guidelines relevant to such assessments, the meaning of “imminence” in assessments of direct threat, ethical challenges, strategies for conducting assessments in both the therapeutic and forensic contexts, the role of reasonable accommodation in direct threat situations, and issues pertaining to the communication of findings and opinions.

Training Objectives

1. Describe how the Americans with Disabilities Act and other federal statutes influence professional practice in the psychological assessment of high-risk personnel.
2. Identify the primary data sources relevant to the assessment of psychological fitness for duty.
3. Systematically integrate findings from multiple data sources to form an opinion about fitness for duty.
4. Navigate complex legal, ethical, and practice challenges when called upon to offer a therapeutic or forensic opinion about a high-risk employee’s fitness for duty.
5. Articulate the limits of what can be disclosed to an employer or other authority about an employee’s risk of harm to self or others with or without the employee’s authorization.

Presenter Biography

David M. Corey, Ph.D., ABPP is a licensed psychologist with nearly 40 years of experience performing high-stakes evaluations of applicants and employees in public safety positions (e.g., police officers, firefighters, emergency dispatchers, corrections officers, parole and probation officers, federal law enforcement positions) and other safety-sensitive positions, including physicians, nurses, and pilots. He is the founding president of the American Board of Police & Public Safety Psychology, and a Fellow of the American Psychological Association (Division 18). He is an ABPP board certified specialist in both forensic psychology and in police and public safety psychology. Dr. Corey’s practice consists primarily of conducting, teaching, and researching about preemployment psychological evaluations, fitness-for-duty evaluations, threat assessments, and competency-to-practice examinations, as well as testifying in civil cases involving such evaluations. He is licensed to practice psychology in Oregon, Hawaii, Washington, California, Utah, and Arizona. With Dr. Yossef Ben-Porath, he is the co-author of the recently released MMPI-2-RF Police Candidate Interpretive Report (PCIR) and the textbook, *Assessing Police and Other Public Safety Personnel Using the MMPI-2-RF: A Practical Guide* (2018; University of Minnesota Press).
